Jones & Jones Architects and Landscape Architects, Ltd. was founded in 1969 on the idea of giving a voice to the landscape, its people and places, through an integrated practice of architecture and landscape architecture.

Its work cannot be categorized stylistically for it is rooted in a profound respect for and celebration of the nature and culture of place. It is as diverse as the places it celebrates. Jones & Jones practice focuses on five design areas: living places, living cultures, green infrastructure, wildlife immersions, and landscape aesthetics.

Given the first ever Firm Award by the American Society of Landscape Architects, Jones & Jones is known both for the unique culture it has created and its philosophy of embracing that, which is challenging and unexplored. Its work and its commitment to future generations have created an enduring legacy.
